Dill to kill a mockingbird character traits

This suggests that Dill probably thought that his father was better than Atticus, by bragging about him. This, in turn, shows that Dill has pride in his father. Later in the book, Dill decides to flee, to Maycomb. There he told Jem and scouts that his parents hated him. When the Boy Scouts asked further, Dill explained 'They're just not interested in me... they get much better without me, I can't help them' (143). Dill went on to explain how his parents never wanted to spend time with him. Dill's perception of his father has gone from being proud of him, to feeling neglected. Dill's change of thinking makes him a dynamic character. However, there are still many characteristics that remain constant throughout the book. Dill is an adventurous, humorous and diverse character. When we are introduced to him, he immediately shows prominent characteristics and stays with him throughout the book. Dill says, 'I'm Charles Baker Harris, I can read' (7). Dill went on to say how he was seven years old, and that he was a bit for his age. He also stated how people call him Dill, he's from Median, Mississippi, and he's seen Dracula. From this information, it is clear that Dill is a diverse character, has many unique traits. Later in the passage, Scout says, Thus we know Dill as Merlin's pocket, whose head is full of eccentric plans, strange longings, and ancient fans (8). Scout then explains how Dill likes and plays ape-like characters in Tarzan and other eccentric characters in Jem and Scout games. From here, the conclusion can be made that Dill is funny. When Jem and Scout tell Dill about Boo Radley, he immediately jumps in, to try and see it. This can make the reader believe that Dill is an adventurous character. From this inference, it is clear that Dill is an adventurous, humorous, diverse character. In terms of conflict, Dill is a troublemaker, but the problem he creates is due to the fact that Dill is a dynamic character and he is unhappy with his fate. Dill reveals to Jem and scouts that he has run away from his parents, wants attention, and is angry with his father (140). He says his parents didn't like him, as shown in this passage, Dill read his narrative: after being tied up in chains and left to die in the basement... by his new father, who disliked him, and was secretly kept alive by a passing farmer who heard his cries for help... Dill worked himself free by pulling chains from walls (140). The conclusion could be made that Dill was unhappy with his fate. As explained earlier, Dill undergoes a change of admiration, then dislikes his father. She feels neglected by her father, so it's clear that Dill is unhappy at the point of this book. Another conclusion can be made that Dill enjoys making trouble. Dill told the Boy Scouts later that the story he told was greatly exaggerated. By fleeing to Maycomb simply because he craves the attention of his father, and then glorifying the story it can make the reader believe that Dill likes to cause trouble. From this conclusion, claims can be made that Dill is a troublemaker unhappy with the change in his fate. All this evidence supports our original thesis, which is that Dill is an adventurous, humorous, diverse and trouble-maker dynamic character. Dill has many interesting traits, such as having an adventurous sense of daring and a good sense of humor. The changes Dill goes through in *To Kill a Mockingbird* show that Dill is dynamic, and that change also makes Dill unhappy. This caused him to flee, which suggests that Dill was a troublemaker.
