Penalties for non-sportsman-like behavior (not during matches), coaches and other team employees: First Strike: Deducts 1 team point. Second attack: Deduct two (2) team points and immediately remove them from the premises for the apparent misconduct of a coach or other team member is an act that the referee considers serious enough to remove the offender from the premises. This may occur before, during or after the match. This includes the use of tobacco products. Obvious misconduct should be punished without warning. Penalties for apparent misconduct by coaches and other team employees: the first attack: three (3) team points deducted and immediately removed from the premises for the remainder of the dual tournament, defined as multiple school (dual) events, or chapters of tournaments starting with a section tournament. PIAA does not reimburse member schools for accommodation, meals, or transportation. PIAA Wrestling Championship member school is responsible for the transportation costs of coaches and participants. Piaa does not reimburse member schools for transportation. The PIAA reimburses member schools for expense allowances to reimburses two coaches per member school. If a participant is eliminated from the additional competition in the championship balance, the member school will be rewarded for accommodation and meals.
