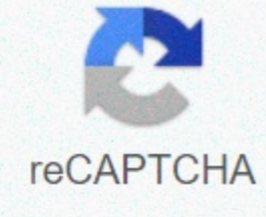

We look forward to launching this programme again in spring 2021. TEMG has the opportunity to participate in in-depth training events where they can promote their knowledge in specific thematic areas. These sessions are offered quarterly and are only open to certified TEMG. These categories equip TEMG to share their newly acquired information with the speakers' office of their local program. However, all master gardeners and working hours involved in maintenance times are encouraged to report them. The required number of project/service hours is 40 for trainees and 25 for certified master gardeners. Half of the required project hours must be in official master gardener projects (20 for trainees and 12.5 hours for certified master gardeners). The CEU requirement remains within 8 hours among trainees and certified master gardeners. A lifelong master gardener must now invest 15 hours a year in project class and/or ceu class. Note these three examples: (1) 15 project hours without project hours, or (2) a combination of project hours and project results totaling 15 or (3) no project hours and 15 project hours. (Of course, classes in either category are encouraged and appreciated and should be reported!) Lifelong master gardeners start 10 years of service, and the additional confession is at the level of 15, 20 and 25 years. REPORTING MASTER GARDENER HOURS It is important that all master gardeners report service hour and continuing training hour (CEU) to maintain master gardener certification and UT expansion demonstrates the impact of the program on the community. Operating times and working news must be reported by 31 December. Attached is a volunteer service report form for accounting purposes. Hours of electronic reporting: A link to the UT Master Gardener website follows: you need to select Sign up and then enter your email address and password. The system sends an email and you confirm your email by clicking the link in the email. (Check your spam if your email doesn't return in minutes.) You can then update the system user profile. You can enter either CEU or PROJECT hours by clicking the appropriate selection on the header bar. Click here to watch a video describing entering hours.
