One of the Navy officers on the flight is invited to dine with the president, but after his meal, the officer falls to the floor and starts foaming at the mouth. Gibbs and his team need to find out if his death is due to natural causes or if someone wanted to kill the president. 3. If you watch the show regularly, you'll know that this boat is usually a focus in Gibbs' basement. The final scene in this episode also ends with Gibbs working on his beloved boat. 4. At one point in the episode, Tony and Ducky pose for photos for the presidential seal on Air Force One when they think Gibbs is unaware of what they're doing. However, Gibbs let them know that he heard the camera click and knew they were posing for photos. Although Tony Gibbs is an employee, he's not afraid to file complaints about the job. One of his complaints to Gibbs is that NCIS doesn't have a private jet. If he and Gibbs are called in to investigate the death of the naval officer, they have to fly commercially, and Tony's not too happy about it. Another thing that bothers him is when he goes through the security point, the guard has no idea what NCIS is. 5. The Palm Pilot is the gadget of choice Agent Todd, who happens to work for the Secret Service in this episode, relies on her Palm Pilot to keep up with her day. She mentions the gadget after Gibbs casually from his list of rules. 6. Gibbs smiled more Gibbs is a lot happier in in early NCIS episodes. In this episode, he smiles a lot more and seems lighter. In recent episodes of NCIS, Gibbs is somber and doesn't smile as much as he used to. This will likely change during NCIS Season 18. Executive Producer Frank Cardea told TV Insider viewers will see a softer side of Gibbs going forward. We saw a hint of his vulnerability during season 17, Episode 20, where he opened up to McGee about his military service and the impact his time in Kuwait had on him. Since the original Roseanne aired in the early 1990s, fans have laughed and cried with America's middle-class family. The Conner family has always been one of the most relatable families on TV and never shies from talking about controversial issues. When ABC announced that the show would return, fans were excited. But with 9 episodes for season one of Roseanne and 11 episodes for season one of The Conners, fans were left wanting a little more. ABC recently renewed The Conners for a second season, leaving many fans asking: Will we have more episodes this season? Fans expressed overwhelming excitement when the network announced they would be bringing Roseanne back in 2019. But Roseanne's run was short-lived after his star Roseanne Barr made controversial comments on Twitter. Following Barr's comments, ABC immediately dismissed Barr and canceled Roseanne. Fans were disappointed and thought this would be the end of a show that had to do with so many viewers. However, ABC had other plans in mind and brought back the rest of the cast for its new show, Conners. The Conners had a very strong opening season, bringing in an average of 7.5 million viewers per week. It was the network's highest comedy and the third highest-rated show overall, coming behind Grey's Anatomy and The Bachelor. The Conners' gets' around a full season' Season one of The Conners premiered after the original reboot was canceled in 2018. Although ABC renamed the show and brought back the rest of the cast, the network ordered only a limited season for the comedy. While most network shows run about 22 episodes, Conners aired only 11 new episodes during his first season. After the success that the network had with season one, ABC has ordered around a full season for Season 2. They have officially released, but TVLine speculates that season 2 will contain about 19 episodes. The exact number will largely depend on Star Laurie Metcalf's Metcalf's TVLine reports that an insider revealed that the show was able to increase their number of episodes after Metcalf and co-star Sara Gilbert made adjustments to their schedule. Gilbert announced last month that she is leaving her talk show The Talk to focus on other projects. The full main cast returns for Season 2. This includes John Goodman, Sara Gilbert, Metcalf, Lecy Goranson, and Ames McNamara. All the stars reportedly received a significant pay rise to return to the show. Will Johnny Galecki return to 'The Conners' full-time? Now that The Big Bang Theory has ended its 12-year run, many fans are wondering if this means former Roseanne star Johnny Galecki returning full-time. Galecki played David Healy from 1992 to 1997. His character married (and later divorced) Darlene Conner and was very popular with fans. Since The Conners premiered, Galecki has appeared in a limited feature, appearing in an episode of the Roseanne reboot and two episodes of The Conners. When asked if a return to the show was in the cards, Galecki told TVLine that he would like to return in a recurring capacity. Although he loves the show and the cast, he says he needs some free time from being on a show full time. While the star hasn't confirmed any upcoming appearances, we'd be surprised if we didn't see him for at least one episode in Season 2. It's been 38 days since Dexter killed his brother, The Ice Truck Killer. Debra lives with him and Doakes follows him everywhere he goes, so he hasn't had anyone since. When 13 Dismembered Bodies Are Found in Bay Harbor, the Miami Metro Metro Department begins a massive manhunt for a man the media calls The Bay Harbor Butcher. Dexter is very involved in the case, considering the bodies they found were his. He doesn't like the name Bay Harbor Butcher and instead prefers The Dark Defender that some call him after it turns out that the butcher is going only after criminals who had slipped by law. Dexter survives by setting sergeant Doakes in for the murders. Dexter's relationships deepen. He learns that his father didn't actually die of heart disease, but that he committed suicide after walking in on Dexter working with one of his kills. Dexter is shattered by this reveal, but ends up having a closer relationship with Debra, who has been living with him for several months because she can't sleep alone after discovering The Ice Truck Killer was her boyfriend. Rita finds out something's going on with Dexter and assumes there's drugs. She believes he's a heroin addict and asks him to go to a 12-step program. On the program he meets Lila, who takes him out for coffee. She seems to be able to see him and it scares him, so he doesn't want to go back. Dexter and Rita's relationship is further complicated when Rita's mother comes to stay with Rita and tells her that Dexter is hiding something. Dexter refuses to go back to NA, so Rita's going to break up with him. Dexter starts dating Lila when he finds out she can see the monster he is, even though she doesn't know he's a murderer, and she doesn't care. Dexter begins to realize, though, that she's pretty crazy and Rita seems to need him. It comes as a surprise to him that he really cares about Rita and the kids. Dexter's out with Lila, Lila starts dating Angel and uses him to get to Dexter. She also breaks into Rita's house, and eventually kidnaps Astor and Cody and takes them to her apartment. Dexter finds them there and Lila locks him and the kids in her house and sets the place on fire. They narrowly escape, and then Dexter finds her and kills her. While attending the 12-step program, Dexter decides he's not going to give in to the urge to kill anymore. He finds out that his birth mother was working with Harny as an informant, and that's what killed her. One of the men who killed her is in prison, one death and the other in the witness protection program. Dexter goes after the one in protection and beats him, but resists the urge to kill him. Later, the man finds him when Lila gives him the address. They fight, but the man runs away. Dexter follows him to his cabin and decides he is who he is, so he kills him. Debra starts dating a man from her gym, but it takes her a long time to trust him. After she trusts him, she realizes she has feelings for Special Agent Lundy, who was brought in for the Bay Harbor Butcher case. They start dating despite a difference in age, and Debra is devastated when the case is closed and must leave. James Doakes continues to follow Dexter, trying to figure out his secret. At one point, he follows him to the NA meeting and believes he's a heroin addict, but he soon finds out that's not true. He finds Dexter in the cabin and finds out he's The Bay Harbor Butcher. They fight and Dexter locks him in the cabin. After many conversations with Doakes, Dexter decides to indicate to himself that it will be easier for Rita and Deb in the long run, but at the last minute, he decides to go ahead with his plan to frame Doakes as the butcher. While with Dexter, Debra gets a call that they're closing in on the butcher. Dexter rushes to the cabin, but the police are already here and the cabin is on fire. Later, he explains that Lila had used his GPS to get to the cabin. Once there, Doakes told her Dexter was the Bay Harbor butcher. She turned on the propane and lit the gas stove, and blew up Doakes to get close to Dexter. Although Lieutenant LaGuerta doesn't believe it, Sergeant Doakes is officially listed as The Bay Harbor Butcher and his death is believed to be suicide. Dexter is free to do his business as usual. Before he goes to DE, Dexter has trouble killing his victims. Paul is killed in an altercation in prison, and Dexter doesn't understand Rita's guilt. Dexter says goodbye to his brother, The Ice Truck Killer, by throwing the doll's head he left in the water for Dexter. Agent Pascal gets LaGuerta's job, but LaGuerta manages to get her fired by causing personal relationship problems when she secretly sleeps with Pascal's fiancée.
