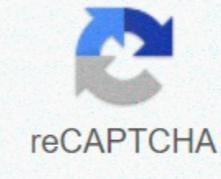

(Courtesy) East High Anchorage has a new name: The East Anchorage School of Betty Davis. The Anchorage School Board voted unanimously Tuesday night to rename the school - one of the nation's most diverse - after the late Betty Davis, a lawmaker and education advocate. I am very, very proud to be able to make this petition," said board member Deena Mitchell. Senator Davis was one of the most violent people I knew. Davis was the first dark-skinned woman elected to the Alaska House of Representatives and the first Black Alaska elected to the state Senate. She also served three terms on the board of an Anchorage school. She died in 2018 at the age of 90. It's so appropriate to call The East after late Davis is diversity, having it one of our great feeder high schools, said Mitchell, who introduced an amendment renaming East High after Davis. Tuesday's council vote capped months of committee work, a flood of public testimony and a sometimes contentious debate through which an Anchorage school would be renamed in Davis' honor. Last year, the city-formed group chose East High as its first choice, followed by Fairview Elementary and Airport Heights Elementary. Davis lived near the East, and it's also in the district she represented in the state legislature. Then the school district committee, citing the survey results, proposed renaming the audience Fairview Elementary and East High after the late senator. During public testimony Tuesday night, more than a dozen people favored renaming the East, including Celeste Hodge Rostden, president of the Alaska Black Caucus. She said the committee's polling was flawed. She described Davis as a champion for all children and East High as rich in diversity. They're the perfect match, she said. We know that change is difficult, but we also know that this change is the right one, she said. It is time to move Anchorage forward, and I cannot think of a better time than it is now in the history of our country and the history of Alaska. Anchorage's father, Cyrus Moore, told the council that renaming the East would honor the appropriate magnitude to the first senator of the black state of Alaska. It will show the diverse student body of Anchorage that we, as a community, celebrate the diversity, justice and achievements of black people, she said. Others argued that East High is deeply rooted in the city's history and should not be renamed. Rename East High would be to lose more than half a century of pride and history," Molly Stoll wrote to the board. Board member Margot Bellamy said Tuesday that she understands those concerns, but the school district had to look forward and think about how renaming the school would take over Davis's powerful legacy to prospective students. For every black, brown, white child in this city who would have the opportunity to learn about Senator Davis - we need that to happen, she said. The petition, approved by the council, also says the name East Anchorage High School will continue to be used for the sport and the Thunderbird mascot will remain the same. Board member Starr Marssett called it a win-win. I think it will keep the east Anchorage High School tradition as far as sports and activities and Thunderbird, she said. But it also honors the name Betty Davis.
