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## Upenn political science minor

On what campus can I study this program? Requirements for minors can be met anywhere on campus by offering these courses for minors. Students can't change from a campus that offers its core campus that doesn't offer their core in order to complete a minor. Minor political science consists of 18 credits, at least one course in each of the following fields of political science: American, theory/methodology, comparative and international relations. Six (6) of these 18 loans should be at 400. When electing this minor, the student must have a junior (fifth semester) standing. Particular attention should be paid to the fact that courses used to meet general education, degree requirements, electives and basic requirements can also be used to meet minor requirements. What is political science? Political science is one of the social sciences. It is a study of systems of governance and state institutions, political activity, political thought and political behavior. Political science is based on many other academic disciplines, including economics, law, sociology, history, philosophy, geography, psychology and anthropology. There are also fields of political science, such as comparative politics, political theory, international relations, international law, public administration and public policy. Political science students are studying how the U.S. government works (and doesn't work) and what can be done to improve governance at the federal, state and local levels. In comparative work in public administration and international relations courses, students study the politics and policies of other countries. Political theory courses explore the ideas of well-known political philosophers, while courses on law and legal process provide knowledge about criminal justice and civil justice systems. You could like this program if... You are in a major where your career is increasingly involved with government regulation or politics or if you want a political or legal background. This can lay the groundwork for a better understanding of your own field. It will also help you understand the increasingly complex political world that confronts them in their own role as citizens. A small part of political science is intended for students who want to improve their ability to be intelligent and critical of issues and perceptions of government and policy.
