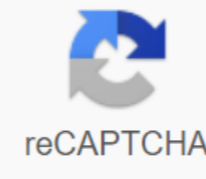

During the Civil War, 1861-1865, African Americans were participating in the war whether they were Freeman or slaves. Many slaves in southern states were forced to assist in the war effort by the Confederate army. On the other hand, northern states turn away black men at the beginning of the civil war, but towards the end of the war the Northern Army (Union) began to accept Negro troops into the army.
