## Clippard ymca outdoor pool hours

Clippard has an invested interest in the community and cares about its well-being. Our desire to improve the quality of life of our employees extends to our community. William & Harriet Clippard Family Branch YBCA Colerain YBCA at the intersection of Cheviot and Poole streets was established with an outdoor swimming pool, two tennis courts, a parking lot and a caravan office. It has operated programs in various locations for several years. Around 1991, George H. Edmiston, president of the YSCA, approached the Clippard family about building a full-service YCCA site. Clippard agreed to make a lead gift to get the fundraiser started. Members of the Clippard family and employees have helped raise funds for the YSCA and continue to do so to this day. Many individuals and organizations grew to challenge and on March 6, 1994, the new Colerain Township facility was dedicated as William and Harriet Clippard Family Branch YSCA. It continues to be one of the most successful YMCAs in Cincinnati and has since undergone three expansions. Clippard Park In 1974, Interstate 275 was completed, and final plans required the Clippingr air park to be cut in half. The northern part of the property has been sold and is now retail space while the 15-acre south part has been donated to The Colerain Township for use as a park. Clippard Park received a makeover in 2009 and now includes two baseball fields, a nature walk, a large skate park, several shelters, a huge children's playground and a water park. Focus on Education Clippard is a sponsor of the FIRST Robotics team and has contributed parts to robotics kits for over 17 years. FIRST learns high school students to incorporate real-world engineering skills into a fun environment. Clippard engineers give themselves time to guide students and help them prepare for the competition. Clippard also hosts the car washes for high school fundraising and organizes plant tours for students to give them a better understanding of manufacturing operations. Internships are frequently offered to students interested in processing and engineering. Clippard Philanthropy is well-known throughout the Colerain Township community and the city of Cincinnati for their involvement with and generosity toward a wide variety of local organizations and charities. Leonard Clippard began a tradition of giving to several charities every year at Christmas, which the company has supported over the years. Clippard also supports other causes throughout the year, including City Gospel Mission, Matthew 25 Ministries, Pro Kids, Relay for Life, Anthony Muñoz Foundation, Susan G. Komen, and Leukemia Society. also supports local food banks. In most cases, offering and participating in local charity events is led by the employee. Clippard proudly supports a number of youth football teams, hired sports teams and baseball programs, as well as other variety service organisations. Over the years, Clippard has been a loyal supporter of the American military and of men and women fighting for our freedom. On many occasions, employees collected items to create care packages for soldiers stationed abroad. Clippard has a collection of letters sent in gratitude for packages, many describing their gratitude for their support at home and a reminder of why they are doing what they do.
