You'll end up in Brixton with a six-piece jazz band, a small plate buffet, gin punch and a performance by the Fidgety Feet dance team, so don't hesitate to tap-tap as unpleasantly as you'd like. Part iconic music venue, and part relentless party retreat, the D.C 9:30 club is something to look at. The two-storey space often approaches its capacity of 1,200 people and packs its ground floor as well as its wrap-around balcony. Everyone (who is anyone) from Bob Dylan and the Beastie Boys, to Adele and Deadmau5 passed 9:30 a.m. on stage while on artist-less nights, the venue hosts a DJ (complete with a light show), instantly converting the audience's standing room into a spirited dance floor. You can't sit down (but maybe you can surf), the music is deafeningly loud (but always good) and there's a tucked-away dive bar (which serves as a comfortable cave) in the corner of the main floor. The place even has a program of rewards for drinks, tickets and merch in honor of its most dedicated regulars. Denver, Colorado, is an adventure playground, with surrounding mountains providing ample opportunities for hiking, climbing, skiing, white water rafting and almost everything in between. In summer, Denverites take the many bike paths dotted around their alpine oasis. The city (and surrounding area) is dotted with scenic bike paths and off-beaten paths that you can explore solo or with the local cycling community, which is robust. Even better, rent a bike (or rent one from the B-Cycle) and join one of the festive group rides. Denver offers everything from beginner-friendly city trails to advanced mountain bike trails, denver is a bike lover's paradise. 01 of 07 Adam-Springer/Getty Images Showcasing the city as well as the surrounding mountains, this 14.5-mile trail is a two-for-one deal. At the entrance to Morrison you will enjoy views of the famous Red Rocks Park and amphitheatre. You can even tread on those red rocks to enjoy the spectacular views of the city. The paved road sneaks through Morrison, Lakewood, Sheridan and Denver, passing through neighborhoods and past parks and golf courses. You can even extend your ride by hitting the Platte River Trail, which connects along the way. Turn this bike ride into a day trip by visiting the Colorado Music Hall of Fame inside Red Rocks and grabbing a rooftop beer and lunch at Ship Rock Grille. 02 of 07 John Coletti/Getty Images You get a history lesson on this 28.5-mile trail. The Colorado Historical Society has established 20-some historical markers along the route ranging in the theme from Native Americans to railroads to local wildlife. This trail starts south of Denver in Englewood, travels through the city center and stretches toward Henderson. Riverside Cemetery, a 77-acre cemetery, is located along the Denver section of the drive Denver is soon pioneers and mayors are buried, and My Brother bar, once a drinker for beatniks like Jack Kerouac and Neal Cassady. If you have children in tow, stop by the Children's Museum in Denver on the Marsico campus. 03 of 07 Evan Semon/ VISIT DENVER Denver Cruiser Ride is fun to watch and even more fun to participate in. This group cycling tradition began among several friends in 2005 and has been gaining momentum ever since. Monthly, weekly rides take place from mid-May to mid-September, and each has a different theme (for example, bubble wrap, adhesive tape and cardboard). You can choose to meet a group of illegal Pete on South Broadway. Monkey Barrel Brewing, Be on Key, Ginn Mill, or Little Machine Beer (there's plenty of beer involved, by the way). The riders will meet at 8:15 p.m and end up in a secret place for the after-party. It's a free ride, but you can purchase a membership in the Denver Cruiser Ride for \$20 a year, which will also give you a bike license plate and deal card. 04 of 07 TripSavvy/ Vincent Mercer This is the Denver version of Central Park in New York. At 165 acres, Washington Park is also one of the largest parks in Denver. If you come to the park by bike, you can reach it from the southern route of the Platte River. Whether you're on a road bike or cruiser, you can spin around a 2.25-mile perimeter in Washington Park (or Wash Park, as locals call it), which is full of flower gardens, a playground and two lakes. You will share a paved path with runners, walkers, and occasionally a roller skater as well. After you have sweated, you can go shopping in the nearby Wash Park district. South Gaylord Street is located six blocks east of Washington Park between Mississippi and Tennessee Avenue and is lined with boutiques, cafes and art galleries. Pop into devil's food for tasty, homemade pastries. Continue to 5 of 7 below. 05 of 07 SWKru/llmaging/Getty Images You can hop on this trail at Confluence Park, which is where Cherry Creek and South Platte River combine. In its entirety, this bike path stretches for more than 40 miles and leads to Franktown. Locals love the ride along this road that passes through the Cherry Creek shopping district. Cherry Creek Mall is part of the neighborhood, but there are also luxury boutiques and galleries in the shopping district. Another good stop on this trail is The Four Mile House & Historic Park, which was once an old stagecoach stop. Today it's a quaint, 12-acre park with a museum where you can learn about denver's first settlers. If you're up for a long ride, you can follow the Cherry Creek Bike Path all the way to Castlewood Canyon State Park to admire the remains of Castlewood Dam, which sent a 15-foot-high wave of water to Denver when it burst in 1933. 06 of Amy's 07 Cahill/Flickr Just a few miles west of the city center is Sloan Lake, a massive body of water bounded by city streets. Until recently, it was mostly the target of the annual Dragon Boat Festival, but the upcoming neighborhood brought with it new breweries and shops. After taking a few laps around the 2.8 mile loop that circles the 177-acre park, head across the street to Edgewater for a slice of pizza at the old base, edgewater inn, a family restaurant that has been around for six decades. 07 of 07 Lightvision, LLC/Getty Images You can take a bike on a couple of different loops in City Park, which is next to the Denver Zoo. Mini Ferri Lake loop is just a few kilometers and loops around the park's central lake. Mile High Loop includes multiple parks and is 3.1 km long. It's called the Mile High Loop because it's perched exactly at 5,280 feet. Conveniently there is a B-Cycle rental near denver zoo or, for fun, you can rent tandem and bikes with large wheels from Wheel Fun Rentals, which has a base in the park. Park.
