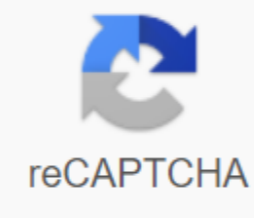

Between the 1930s and the early 1960s, the volume of mail , especially business mail, increased significantly, and it became clear that a better system was needed. On July 1, 1963, the USPS introduced a postcode (zone improvement plan) system. In 1967, postal codes became mandatory in all letters. A zip code is a five-digit number that represents a specific location in the United States. The advanced ZIP + 4 code adds a hyphen and four additional digits to an even more accurate location. Here's how it works: Advertising First digit indicates a status. The numbers are increasing as you move west. Several states share each digit - 2, for example, represented by the District of Columbia, Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia.The second and third digits represent regions within the state - the first three digits created by the Section Center Measures (SCF) code. SCFs is the regional headquarters for mail sorting and distribution. The fourth and fifth digits refer to more specific areas, such as post offices and postal delivery zones in a city or city. Robert Moon, a postal inspector with the United States Postal Service, proposed a postcode system as early as 1944. In 1943, the United States Postal Service began using two-digit zone codes to identify postal zones in larger cities. Since 1967, the zip code has become increasingly binding. The word ZIP comes from the accronraation of zone improvement plan. The original zip code consisted of 5 digits. In 1983, zip +4 was introduced to make delivery to densely populated areas more efficient. If you're looking for the current time or time zone in Memphis, Tennessee, look no further. The central time can be set by subtracting six hours of universal time (CUT), subtracting one hour from the Eastern Time Zone (EST) time by adding one hour to the mountain time zone (MTZ) or adding two hours to the Pacific Time Zone (PTZ). Memphis time is one hour outside New York, New York time and two hours before Los Angeles, California time. Memphis is in the same time zone as the major cities of Chicago, Illinois; Dallas, Texas; St. Louis, Missouri; Minneapolis, Minnesota; New Orleans, Louisiana, and Atlanta, Georgia. Tennessee, like most The United States, observes the notes Save time every year. Daylight saving time starts on the second Sunday of March and ends on the second Sunday of November. During this time, the central time can be calculated by subtracting five hours from the coordinated universal time. About two-thirds of Tennessee state falls into the central time zone, including all of West and Middle Tennessee and several Eastern Tennessee counties. In western Kentucky, parts of the Florida panhandle, and most of Texas are also in the Central Time Zone, as well as all of Mississippi, Arkansas, Alabama and Missouri. If you travel east of Memphis on I-40, you would cross into the Eastern Time Zone in Roane County.Midnight (12 p.m.) Middle time is 1 p.m. eastern time zone.Noon (12 p.m.) The central time is 1:00. Eastern time zone. Midnight (12:00) mid-time is in the mountain time zone at 11 a.m. Noon (12:00) mid-time is 11 a.m. in the mountain time zone. Midnight (12:00 p.m.) central time is 10:00.
