Scottsdale AZ PIMC provides direct health care services to 156,815 patients. The tribes that make up the Phoenix Service Unit are, The Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation, the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indigenous Community, and the St. Lucy's District of the Tohono O'odham Nation, the Apache Tonto Tribe, the Yavapai-Apache Indigenous Tribe, and the Yavapai-Precott Indigenous Tribe. Tribal members who receive care at PIMC are often residents of the Phoenix metropolitan area and come from tribes throughout the U.S. PIMC also provide specialized care to rural and remote reserve health care centers in Arizona, Nevada, and Utah. Population served The tribal identity of eligible beneficiaries receiving care in PIMC is representative of 67% of the 574 federally recognized tribes. The 5 tribes most represented by PIMC's patient population are the Navajo Nation of Arizona, New Mexico and Utah, the Pima-Maricopa Salt River Indigenous Tribe, the Yaqui Easter Tribe, the Gila River Pima Maricopa Tribe, and the Tohono O'odham Nation.
