VERO BEACH, Fla. — The superintendent of the School District of Indian River County introduced the district's reopening plans Friday for the 2020-21 school year. We want to design a plan that's best for all students, said Dr. David Moore in a Facebook Live message. WATCH PRESS CONFERENCE: FULL PRESS CONFERENCE: School resume plan in Indian River County Moore presented students and parents with three options for the new school year: Traditional in-classroom learning with health and safety procedures in place when school starts on Monday, Aug. 10 Virtual School: Full-time online teaching at home Transitional Distance learning Model: Full-time online teaching/live streamed lessons at home Students have until July 10 to choose which option to participate. In the Virtual School option, each family would drive the pace of learning and decide when to take each lesson, and how long to spend on each lesson. The pace of this virtual application is based on the parent and the child's agreement, Moore said. You get to sign and take classes in the morning, some in the afternoon. You may reach out to the teacher for some facilitation or some support. To sign up for the virtual school option, call Chris Taylor, Director of Virtual Education, at 772-564-3033. Virtual School will begin Aug. 12. For the Transitional Distance Learning Model, students would follow a live clock schedule at home, and parents would commit to in-home virtual learning for the first nine weeks. Students would log in practically during the clock schedule and attend lessons with their teacher live. This is a model where you would plan to return to school, but you're just not there yet, Moore said. Options available to students in Indian River County Schools. Masks will be encouraged, but not required, on the school campus. Hand disinfectants will be available in all parts of the school campus, and students will receive a temperature check upon admission to the school. In addition, social distancing will be practiced as much as possible in classrooms, cafeterias, gyms and other common areas, and there will be one-way traffic in school corridors.
