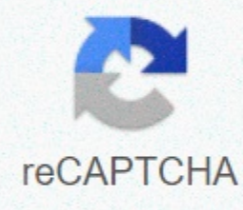




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## Ear labelling worksheet

Answers EnchantedLearning.com Label the Ear Anatomy Diagram Human Anatomy Sound is collected by the pinna (the visible part of the ear) and directed through the outer ear canal. The sound causes vibration in the ear's uterus, which in turn shakes a series of three small bones (hammer, anvil, and mixer) in the middle ear. Tremors are transmitted to the shape of the cacle in the inner ear; Kakeel is lined with sensitive hair that produces nerve signals that are sent to the brain. Read the definitions below, then label the ear anatomy chart. anvil - (also called incus) is a small bone that passes vibrations from the hammer to the female. Cochlea - a spiral-shaped, fluid-filled inner ear structure; eardrum - (also called tympanic membrane) is a thin membrane that vibrates when sound waves reach it. Eustachi tube - a tube that connects the middle ear to the back of the nose; equals the pressure between the middle ear and the outside air. When you pop your ears as you change altitude (go up a mountain or on a plane), you are pushing against the air in your middle ear. Hammer - (also called malleus) is a small bone that passes vibrations from ear-to-anvil umm. Nerves - It carries electrochemistry signals from the inner ear (cochlea) to the brain. The ear canal is out - the tube through which the sound travels to the ear serum. pinna - (also called auricle) is a visible part of the outside ear. Collects the sound and directs it to the semicircular channels of the outside ear canal - three tube rings filled with fluid attached to the cokel in the inner ear. They help us maintain our sense of balance. Stirrup - (also called stapes) is a small, U-shaped bone that passes vibrations from stirrer to cochlea. It is the smallest bone in the human body (its length is 0.25 to 0.33 cm).
