His inner narratives are sometimes dreams, sometimes hallucinating and sometimes indefinable, dominated by galleon and its captain, sailing to a huge, sullen crew at the deepest point of the Marianas Trench, Challenger Deep. The metaphor is not exactly subtle, but Shusterman finds an unexpected resonance with his data-tar seams in wood, human ballast. The external reality still registers: the people around Caden run smut humor, scolding, threats, and avoidance of pressure on him by changing the behavior he no longer controls. Shusterman has mined personal experience of mental illness with his son Brendan, whose line drawings mirror Caden's fragmentation of rotating lines terribly reminiscent of Van Gogh. It's a powerful collaboration and an important novel credibility. As Caden says: There is no such thing as a proper diagnosis, and although his story may not represent experience of mental illness, it makes the symptoms lived in reality in a way readers don't easily forget. Caden Bosch thinks there's someone in his high school who wants to kill him. But that's not all. There are things happening outside of typical space and time constraints that he doesn't understand. He feels almighty and frighteningly powerless at the same time. Caden slowly drifts away from friends and family and deeper into his mind until his parents recognize him in a mental hospital for further evaluation and treatment. Shusterman beautifully uses dual narratives that become increasingly intertwined in this remarkable story. In addition to the grounded-in-reality narrative, he introduces another world where Caden is out at sea, with a master, a girl named Calliope, a parrot, and more. All these characters end up in the game with real world colleagues, in the hospital and beyond. KIRKUS - STARRED REVIEW - 2/15 Fantasy becomes a reality in the study of mental illness based in part on the experience of the author's son, who is also a book illustrator. For 14-year-old Caden Bosch, his gradual descent into schizophrenia is an attempt to reach the bottom of Challenger Deep, which is the deepest place on earth. In the inner reality, placed in Caden's real life – where his behaviour slips from anxiety to the signage of hearing and compulsion – a master like Ahab promises wealth for fidelity, while his parrot demands rebellion for the possibility of a shore. Shusterman unmoors readers with his constant use of the current tense and lack of transitions, but Caden's sea-hallucinated-turned-subplot becomes clearer when his parents put him in Seaview Hospital's psychiatric unit with his idiosyncratic team of patients and staff. But Caden's disorientation and the unease of others make the story coolly real. Except at the height of Caden's delusions, there is nothing romantic – just off-kilter enough to show how easily unrealistcity acquires its logic and wit. The illustrator, who has struggled with mental illness himself, charts the journey with abstract line drawings that convey Caden's illness as well as his knowledge. When the depths are revealed by the twist of the logic of dreams, and Caden chooses fidelity, the sea becomes a good metaphor for the mind: amorphous and tumulous, but ultimately navigable. From an adventure perspective as well as a plot, this unusual foray into schizophrenia should leave readers with a deeper understanding of the condition. There he is paranoid for no reason, thinks that people are trying to kill him, and shows obsessive compulsive behavior. In his second world, he is part of a team of pirate captains on a trip to Challenger Deep, the ocean's deepest trench. There he is a paranoid, wary mercurial master and his mutinous parrot, and tries hard to interpret the pomisings of his compatriots as they sail into uncharted waters towards unknown dangers. Slowly, Caden's fantasy and paranoia begin to take over until his parents have only one choice left. Shuster's latest novel gives readers a glimpse into teenage mental illness, according to Caden Bosch. HORN BOOK - STARRED REVIEW - March/April Issue This novel is a challenge for the reader in its first lines: author Shusterman takes us to the seemingly random, rambling and surreal fantasies of fifteen-year-old Caden Bosch (yes, it makes sense to associate him with the artist Hieronymus) as mental illness increasingly regulates his consciousness. The fantasies of a pirate ship are ruled by an abrasive one-eyed master and his parrot, its blanket teeming with forest (for example) mingling with Caden's somewhat more comprehensible accounts of family and school until his parents have him admitted to a psychiatric hospital. As he responds to drugs and treatments, Caden's fantasies become increasingly transparent, showing themselves in imaginative, ungovernable versions of his hospital psychiatrist, Dr. Poirot, and his fellow patients. The disorientation Shusterman generates through a first-person narrative requires patience, but it's an apt, effective way to bring readers to nightmarish anxiety and despair-in and out of it. Caden's narrative is all the more gripping because there is an obvious abundance of wit and creativity in the eccentric specificity of his insights. Clearly written with love, the novel moves; but it is also dry, insightful humor.
