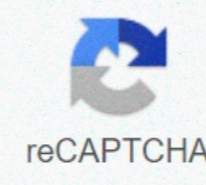

There's an old gardening that says the key to growing a large plant is to put a 50-cent sample in a \$5 hole. That's not a lie. Get your money worth by planting a tree properly. After researching that you've chosen the best tree to plant in your yard, it's time to put it in the ground. Digging a transplant pit of the right size is key to getting your new tree off to a good start, but there are some other factors at play, too, such as timing. Autumn is the best time to do your dig. This is because warm summer temperatures can highlight new plants, especially if they don't get much rain, so planting in autumn gives them some extra time to establish themselves before hot weather arrives again the following year. Adding a new tree to your yard can add beauty and value to your home so use these tips to get planted. First, make a hole two to three times as wide as the root ball of your tree. Dig up to the depth of the root ball so that when it rests on the bottom of the hole, the tree is on the same level with the ground as it was in its tank. Treat the root ball carefully to keep it in the full while you place it in the hole. Once it's in, make it so the best side of the tree is facing Because you want to. With burlapped root balls, cut the wire and remove the quidding (or at least push it to the bottom of the hole). Garden Test Tip: Plant small trees (reaching 10 meters or less) at least 10 feet from the base of your home and service lines. plant large trees (30 to 70 feet high) at least 5 meters from foundations and lines; Give trees 20 meters 6 meters of distance. Return the soil you dug from the pit, adding it evenly around the root ball and lightly packing down the ground in the process. Check the trunk frequently to make sure it's straight. Use soil residum as a bar to create a watering well. Move the wedding into the ground below and through the root ball. The wedger should be loosely tied to the trunk; Don't whip it too hard so the trunk can't bend in the wind. Large trees may need two or three pegs located a few feet from the trunk. After six months, enough roots will grow to hold the tree in place so you have to remove any risks to allow the tree to continue growing naturally. Water the tree immediately after planting and keep the soil around it moist for a few weeks afterwards. At this point, the roots will start to grow into the surrounding soil, and you can start to gradually reduce the irrigation frequency. A 3-inch layer of straw around the base of the tree but no touching of the trunk will keep the straw strawbeds out and reduce water loss.
