

Inmates need money to access multiple privileges, such as weekly shopping in prisons, phone calls, using provided email services, and co-payments when they need medical or dental services using the electronic tablets provided. Some county jails charge a per-night fee for prison fees. What is an emissary? It is a shop in the prison. Emissary days are usually held once a week and can only be used if an inmate has funds in an emissary account, such as a bank account within an institution. If an inmate has a job, his or her salary will also be credited to this account. The envoy sells a variety of products that prisoners can buy if they have money in their books. Items sold include clothing, shoes, snacks and food, as well as sanitary products such as soaps, shampoos and razors. The envoy also sells products such as books, magazines, televisions, radios, cards, headphones, MP3 players, electronic tablets, songs and educational programs. They also sell paper, envelopes and stamps for inmates to write loved ones, friends and family. The facility will provide stamps and paper to poor inmates – entitled to no money in their envoy accounts for at least 30 days. How to send money to inmates? Sending money to inmates varies from state to state, depending on how you accept money for changes in inmates by contracted money transfer companies, if they are county, state, or federal. Federal prisons and some state-level prisons have centralized banking systems, so you don't need to know where they are in particular, and they're in state systems like California, Texas, Florida DOC, or FPOP. How do I send money using MoneyGram? Some facilities allow you to deposit cash through the lobby or through the lobby window standalone kiosk in the visiting room.
