He became known for playing the main character Bruno in the Holocaust film *The Boy in Striped Pajamas* (2008), for which he received nominations for the British Independent Film Award and the London Film Critics Circle Award for Young British Performer of the Year at the age of 11. For his top performance as Hugo Cabret in Martin Scorsese's *Drama* *Hugo* (2011), Butterfield received considerable praise and was awarded the Young Hollywood Award for Breakthrough-male performance and was nominated for the Critics' Choice Film Award for Best Young Performer and Empire Award for Best Male Newcomer, among other accolades. He was nominated for the British Independent Film Award for best actor for his role of Nathan Ellis in *Morgan Matthews' X+Y* (2014). In 2019, Butterfield began starring as Otis Milburn in the Netflix sitcom *Sex Education*. Butterfield's early life was born in Islington, London, and is the son of Jacqueline Farr, a psychologist, and Sam Butterfield, an advertising copywriter. [3] [4] [5] Butterfield's career began acting at the age of 7 at the Islington Young Actors Theatre. Later, he secured small roles in the 2006 TV drama *After Thomas* and the 2007 film, *Son of Rambow*. [3] [6] In 2008, he had a guest role playing Donny in the TV series *Ashes in the Ashes*. [7] In the same year, aged 10, he played the main role in boy in striped pajamas. Director Mark Herman said they came across Butterfield early in the audition process. He was on the first audition tape he received and was the third hopeful he met in person. Herman thought Butterfield's performance was excellent, but only decided to drop him after auditioning hundreds of other boys, so no stone was left upside down. [8] Producer David Heyman and director Mark Herman were looking for someone who was able to portray the main character's innocence, so they asked each of the children what they knew about the Holocaust. Butterfield's knowledge was subtle and he was deliberately held like this throughout filming, so it would have been easier for him to convey his character's innocence. The final scenes of the film were shot at the end of the production period to prepare both him and Jack Scanlon for the dramatic end of the film. [9] He defeated hundreds of boys in the role and also successfully auditioned for a role in *Mr. None* for which he auditioned He chose not to pursue his last role. [6] In 2008, Butterfield appeared in *Merlin*'s episode of *The Beginning of the End?* played a young druid boy sentenced to death by Uther Pendragon because he feels he feels from the boy's magic. Butterfield appeared as Mordred in a series of subsequent episodes. In 2010, he had a small role in *The Wolfman*. [10] He starred as Norman Green in *Nanny McPhee* and *The Big Bang* (2010). The film, and its performance, both received positive reviews. At the age of 13 he played the main character and title in Martin Scorsese's *Hugo*, adapted from the novel *The Invention of Hugo Cabret*. *Hugo* was released on November 23, 2011 and achieved critical success. Butterfield played the title role of Andrew Ender Wiggin in the film adaptation of Orson Scott Card novel *Ender's Game*. The film was released in 2013. After shooting the game *Ender*, Butterfield was immediately cast in the coming-of-age British drama *X+Y* [11] as Nathan Ellis, a mathematical savant on the autism spectrum chosen to compete with other gifted children in a UK team in an internationally renowned maths competition. The film premiered on 5 September 2014 at the Toronto International Film Festival[12][13] and was released in UK cinemas on 13 March 2015. Butterfield's performance received widespread critical acclaim[14] and saw him nominated for the BIFA Award for Best Actor. Butterfield at the Moët BIFA British Independent Film Awards 2014 Later in 2013, Butterfield was reported to be in talks for a role in *King of Castle*[15] and in May, was cast in *The White Circus*. [16] In early 2014, Butterfield participated in a film adaptation of *Ten Thousand Saints*. [17] which was released on August 14, 2015. [18] In November 2015, he joined the ensemble cast of *Shane Carruth*'s third film, *The Modern Ocean*. [19] In 2016, she starred as Jacob Jake Portman at *Miss Peregrine's home for quirky children*. [20] He also starred as Gardner Elliot in the film *The Space Between Us* and as Sebastian in *The House of Tomorrow*[21] in 2017. In 2018, Butterfield found himself in the lead role of Otis Milburn in the Netflix sitcom, *Sex Education*. [22] The series was released on 11 January 2019 in critical acclaim. [23] Butterfield's other work enjoys making music, and he released a mashup of songs *Teenage Dirtbag* by *Wheat* and *Making Plans for Nigel* by *XTC*. [24] Along with his brother, he is part of a music group called *Mambo Fresh*. In late 2012, Butterfield co-wrote a video game based on his iPad series with his father and brother called *Racing Blind*. [25] The game was released in the App Store on April 7, 2013. Butterfield participates in competitive Nintendo games. In 2017 he competed in the Nintendo World Championships, where he was eliminated early in the invitation. [26] It is enthusiastic player of competitive *Super Smash Bros.* and has signed with the esports team *Panda Global* under the label *Stimpy*. His first appearance with the organization was in *Genesis 6*. [27] In October 2020, he signed with *Team Liquid*. [28] Since 2017 Butterfield has taught acting masterclass at *The Reel Scene* acting school in London. The three-day *Asa Butterfield Masterclass* covers improvisation techniques and students work on scenes from Butterfield's films, which were then shot on the last day. [29] In 2018, the students appeared as extras in the film *Greed* in which Butterfield appeared.
