Chapter 10, Miss Maudie says, Mockingbirds don't do one thing but make music for us to enjoy. They don't eat up people's gardens, don't nest corncribs, they don't do one thing but sing their hearts to us. So it is a sin to kill a mockingbird (p. 119). With this quote you can see that the mockingbird symbolizes innocence, because mockingbirds just sing us and do nothing to try and harm us; instead, they are trying to do good things. Mockingbird symbolizes innocence, so the name means that innocence is killed or destroyed. Throughout this novel, there are some characters that can be seen as mockingbirds like Boo Radley. Boo Radley is like a mockingbird because he doesn't harm anyone; instead, he leaves gifts to Scout and Jem, covers scout with blanket during fire, and then ends up saving the children of Bob Ewell and other attackers. So going back to Tom Robinson, Tim and Tom probably have similar names for the reason that Atticus was chosen to defend Tom, and that's what he did. Tim Johnson represents the mob, injustice, and something Atticus has to fight. Scout had started her first day at school and to get to school, she had to go to Radley House.
