Twin Lakes School The first classroom of the 21st century in Santa Cruz County has opened at Twin Lakes Church in Aptos. The building, built at a cost of \$12.1 million, is an impressive 40,500 square square metres built on three levels and has 12 classrooms, a computer lab, science lab, various rooms for church programs, and an amphitheatre. The school's new building has long been in the campus master plan, but the current vision of the project began to take shape about eight years ago. One of the key leaders in the effort was Executive Pastor Mark Spurlock, who kindly made hiavailable for a guided tour of the facility. It has a wide range of high-tech touches, including LED lighting systems in all facilities that recognize when people enter a room, and when they go out so the lights can be turned off. In addition, there are ambient light sensors that adjust the level of lighting to be well balanced with the natural light of the windows. The building is controlled by climate to keep the indoor temperature at a Fahrenheit of even 70 degrees, which has been determined to be the best temperature for students to learn. In addition, unconcerned rooms can be left cold or warm, while the rooms that are occupied will have their temperatures kept at optimum levels. Each classroom has a long whiteboard, on which you can project the output from AppleTVs, Chrome Casts or a scanner to the teacher's desk to project old-fashioned printed material. Teachers can also write all over the white board with trendy dry erase markers, combining the best of old school and new technologies. The structure was designed by parishioners Rich Iffland of Iffland Engineers (designers of the iconic Santa Cruz Lighthouse). Mr. Iffland studied the latest in school and classroom designs around the country, but particularly in the Seattle area, where they have opened dozens of new schools in the past 20 years. The structure was built by local company Bogard Construction, which has built most of the buildings on the Twin Lakes campus. They broke ground in 2014 and were able to finish the entire project on time and on budget. The funding for the project came entirely from donations within the church. The school mainly serves Kindergarten students through 5th grade, with high school children entering to use science and computer labs. With expanded capacity, the school has more space to accept a few dozen new and lucky students and are currently accepting applications for enrolment.
