It is the primary language of public education, government and most media outlets. The majority of Belizeans speak creole based in English regardless of ethnicity, and Belize Creole (also known as Kriol) in most informal, social and interethnic dialogues. When the Creole language exists alongside lexifier language like Belize, the Creole continuum develops between the Creole and lexifier languages. This is called code switching. Therefore, it is difficult to support or distinguish the number of Creole speakers compared to English speakers. The Creole of Belize can best be described as the nation's lingua franca.
