Kappa has more than 260,000 women, 140 collegiate chapters in the United States 307 alumni from around the world. Kappa Kappa Gamma is considered a brotherhood of women because it was founded before the concept corporation was created, but it is usually referred to as a female sorority because it only accepts women. Bennett and Boyd decided to create a women's fraternity and sought members not only for literary work but also for social development, starting with their friend Mary Moore Stewart. Stewart, Boyd and Bennett met in the amateurs at Belles Lettres Hall, a literary society where women were active members to plan their new society. They recruited three extra women, Anna Elizabeth Willits, Martha Louisa Stevenson and Susan Burley Walker, to join the founding of the fraternity. Minnie Stewart House in Monmouth, where the corporation was founded by six founders, met at Willit's home to begin work laying the Alpha chapter on Kappa Kappa Gamma. They chose a golden key as their badge, and they had the badges that had been crafted by the Bennett family jewel for their official debut. The official charter fraternity was drafted by Stewart's father, who was a lawyer in illinois. On October 13, 1870, the founders unveiled their intention to organize a women's fraternity by entering the Monmouth Chapel, a public campus court, wearing their golden key marks in their hair. Although the groundwork of the organization began as early as 1869, the 1876 convention voted to recognize October 13, 1870 when the official Founders' Day is not earlier, a charter date could be determined. In 1871, the fraternity chartered its beta chapter at a seminar near St. Mary's. The following year, the fraternity opened its Gamma chapter at Smithson College and the Delta chapter at Indiana University. Although the Beta and Gamma chapters were unable to survive for more than a few years, the Delta chapter became the fraternity's oldest continuously active chapter (Alpha was temporarily closed in 1874 but later re-established) and helped much with the organization of the fraternity in its early years. In 1892, Kappa Gamma was the first female fraternity to published the quarterly magazine The Key. Today, it is published every three years through watkins' printing company. In 1890, Kappa Kappa Gamma Beta alpha chapter became the first sorority of the University of Pennsylvania, led by President Martha Bunting[7] Moving towards Panhellenic in 1891. [8] But there were no major movements from this meeting, and none of them occurred for a decade when Alpha Phi invited Pi Phi Beta, Kappa Alpha Theta, Kappa Kappa Gamma, Delta Gamma, Gamma Gamma, Delta Delta, Alpha Chi and Omega To Chicago conference 24. This meeting resulted in the organization of the first fraternity association and the first cross-party organization on college campuses. In the 1960s, G. William Domhoff, writing Who Rules America?, listed Kappa Kappa Gamma as one of four or five corporations with nationwide prestige. From 1929 to 1952, the organization was headquartered in downtown Columbus, Ohio. In 1952, Kappa Kappa Gamma bought its first headquarters at 530 East Town Street, which is now part of the historic area of East Town Street. The brotherhood flower, fleur-de-lis, combines the fraternity colors in navy blue and light blue. Since fleur-de-lis is a mythical symbol, iris is often replaced for practical purposes. The jewel of the Brotherhood is blue sapphire. Sapphire is recognized as a symbol of truth, sincerity and persistence. The brotherhood's coat of arms combines all the symbols of brotherhood: key, Greek stars, new member pin, fleur-de-lis, owl and leader Minerva. Kappa Kappa Gamma used the tradition of Leadership in many previous fraternity publications, but since June 2012 the new fraternity tagline Aspireline Aspireline was changed. In June 2018, it was announced that a new brand with the label Dream Boldly, Fully Live will be introduced in the 2018-2019 academic year. Characters in the Member Mark are the golden key. The standard sign is one inch long and is sometimes a jewel in sapphires, pearls or diamonds. The key on the front is the Greek letters (stem) and AQO (ward). Often, the initials of the member who owns the sign are entered on the back of the sign. The original keys were larger and were not standardized; many were specially made member descriptions, sometimes stones such as opal. They were also worn by members of the sternum, forehead or hair, while today, the marks are uniformly worn on the left side of the chest. The badge shall be strictly worn by members initiated as members of the membership. The Brotherhood is encouraging badges to return to headquarters after a member's death. New, un initiated members of Kappa Kappa Gamma wear different characters that have sigma within the delta enamelled silver two-color fraternity, navy blue and light blue. The first branch of philanthropy is supported by the Kappa family through the Kappa Kappa Gamma Foundation, which provides funding for Kappa museums, members-only scholarships, education and management programming, and the Rose McGill Foundation, which provides emergency financial assistance to those in need. The second branch supports the local community by encouraging chapters and alumni associations to volunteer and to raise money for charities in their areas. The third branch covers the entire fraternity through its national philanthropy, Reading Is Fundamental (RIE). In 2004, the Brotherhood adopted a new version of the 2004 Local KKG chapters may support other foundations or philanthropists separately. The board of collegiate chapters includes board members that include the president, treasurer, secretary and officials assigned chapter duties such as membership, standards, events and philanthropy. These officials often also supervise committees. Chapter officials are advising and reporting to alumni volunteers who serve as chapter counselors, traveling with Leadership Consultants and Fraternity Council officials. The National Brotherhood Council consists of six elected alumni (President, four Vice-Presidents and Treasurer) and two non-voting members (national panhellenic conference delegate and fraternity executive director). Their work is supported by 11 content directors, 14 district directors, dozens of content specialists, various committees and employees of Kappa Kappa Gamma headquarters. As of January 2018 moved its headquarters from Columbus, Ohio, to a new facility in Dublin, Ohio. In 2004, the Leadership Academy began offering undergraduate and alumni members an intensive management development for an outdoor weekend retreat. Programming Leadership Academy has been developed in collaboration with Tompeters' Company and Bradford Woods, an outdoor educational institution in Indiana. Recently, the Leadership Academy has held the Heartland Conference Retreat Center in Marengo, Ohio, near fraternity headquarters. Monmouth Duo Women's Fraternity Pi Beta Phi was founded by I.C. Sorosis at Monmouth College in 1867. Kappa Kappa Gamma was founded in college in 1870 and 1888 by I.C. Soros against greek stars and changed its name to Pi Beta Phi. Since both fraternities have their origins in the same college three years apart, they are often called the Monmouth Duo. On campuses with chapters of Pi Beta Phi and Kappa Kappa Gamma, groups often have joint social and philanthropic events. Controversy Hazing Additional Information: A list of hazing deaths in the United States in the 1997 TELECAST 20/20 featured an exposé of hazing in a sorority system that included hazing three members of Kappa Kappa Gamma dePauw University and a local corporation lambda Delta Sigma at Concordia College. On November 6, 1997, three members of Kappa Kappa Gamma were accused of branding three promises[12] with cigarettes in the family after heavy drinking. After the fire, promises were encouraged across campus and sweating to be in the fraternity house. [13] The result was serious enough to send one of the promises to the hospital with minor burn injuries. [14] The discovery of the incident led to the initiation of investigations by the fraternity and campus. Members who were involved in the incident did not accuse the state of Indiana of criminal negligence under the hazing statute, as was reported. [13] They did not, however, face a possible trial for alcohol possession, but because of the difficulty of proving who offered alcohol, members were given community service instead. [13] DePauw's reaction to the chapter's blurring was to put a chapter on social experimentation until 1999. Thirteen members who had been involved in or had become aware of the incident were granted a one-half-year period of employment and social probation to participate, and their chapter voted to maintain membership in the chapter. In 2014, the Kappa Kappa Gamma chapter of the University of Connecticut was expelled from the University of Connecticut until 2017. They must also have an average of the minimum class so that they can be considered eligible. Women must participate in the recruitment of female sororities and, if invited to join, they will enter the new membership period, which will be the first of three phases of membership. In six to eight weeks, new members will be starting and taking part in the second phase of membership as active collegiate members. Upon graduation, members enter the third and final phase of membership and become alumni. Alumni have the opportunity to join local alumni associations and remain active participants in fraternity life, participating in social and philanthropic events, volunteering as advisers to collegiate chapters and serving as officials of the Fraternity Council. Of the 30 closed chapters have been re-chartered and none of the re-chartered chapters have been closed. Active chapters exist in 41 of the 50 states and the District of Columbia as well as three of the 10 Canadian provinces. The largest number of active chapters in the country is California, 17 active chapters and one passive chapter.
