However, after seeing my credit report I have seen that the Austin Institute of Art is reporting a balance of 5,517.00. This debt is invalid, as it only used federal school loans to pay for the school and had no remaining debts to the institution. Although I was told this would be removed from my credit, it has been over thirty days since I've had communication with the financial aid office and the Austin Art Institute is still reporting this invalid debt to the three credit reporting agencies, which is negatively affecting my credit. I request that this invalid debt be removed from the three credit information agencies, as this false information is violating the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act.... Everything was so good; I rented a motel room so I could attend the interview, I was accepted, I kept constant contact with the staff (which was very nice), one of them even helped me find a great place to live, which are the apartments that are literally a stone's throw from campus. I had moved all the way from my home state, where I had lived ALL MY LIFE, to my new apartment about 3 weeks from the beginning to the semester. The following week, however, I got a frightening text message from the school saying they are closing and my classes are no longer available. That... This was one of the most horrible moments of my life. ￼The staff were very friendly and helpful. I called headquarters, told me what was going on, I was in tears, and they told me to apply for classes online. Okay, I didn't leave behind everything I've ever known and made all these sacrifices so I could go for online courses. So, this is that not even the staff knew it would happen. They told me that they had just announced one day that they were closing and one of the beautiful people who helped me get there had a thaw and had to get out of it. I had a breakup and spent the next 2 days shaking and vomiting. My nerves could not take... The next 3 months, I had the most horrible taste in my mouth that wouldn't go away, which apparently has something to do with your nerves. He was a nervous reck. Fortunately I have found NOSSI College of Art, they have been very good to me and are a very professional art university. Many alumni of the Art Institutes had moved there and told me I dodged a bullet. I believe them. This all took place in 2018 and I still have this text message from them to remind me of what led me to Nashville. However, in addition to things turned out, I still find the whole experience traumatic. 1.0 5-star Grade: Graphic Design I'm currently trying to apply to public health grade schools, but I went to a semester at the Art Institute. The branch I went to is closed, so I can't contact the registrars office there, there's no headquarters or customer service phone number that anywhere, and I guess the two transcript application forms I submitted were lost somewhere? I am currently in limbo, possibly not able to apply to grade school because this school is so incompetent that it cannot establish a job transfer system. Basically I'm doomed to spend months (and I mean I've spent a cumulative year in back-and-forth contact with the art institute to get my transcript sent to various schools over the years) for the rest of my life trying to get a transcript. Absolutely absurd. The first time I tried to get my transcript they tried to tell me I had a remaining balance, luckily I had a receipt to prove that I had paid it tot.no would let them take that out. Horrible school, it has to be completely closed. 1.0 5 star Grade: Fashion I'm not the person who attended this scam from a school, although I was about a moment in time. My cousin, from whom he has asked me to write this on his behalf, as we both have our share of this financial drain on a school. From what I saw and actually happened 100% matches all the reviews given from the school itself. I initially heard about the school through my cousin, and then a representative who came to make an entire presentation about the school itself in order to try to sell the program to my entire high school class. As it was at the time, I'm in addition to my partner's career now, I was looking to get into the culinary as the naive young man thought to me that's what I wanted to do for the rest of my life. So, in search of schools, I was looking at Johnson and Wales along with the art institute, so I decided to take a tour of the campus itself. Now, fortunately, I had my mom with me, which has good common sense and a good ability to smell fake or out of things about certain things or places. One thing I immediately pointed out and pointed out to me was the fact that the school was extremely small for a lot as it blurred about the current attendance of high school students. So, actually, I seriously dodged a bullet with them, later I chose to go to a community college for cost reasons. If I had gone here though I can only imagine how badly it would have been finetically ruined. Now, as for my cousin, I wasn't so lucky as I actually attended this fake institution. Not to mention this seems recently, guess the plan finally dried up, sold the school to another company. So yes, even if it still open, don't even give them the time of day, no one at this point will ever recognize a degree of them as they have thoroughly dragged their name through the mud and then some. The only decent thing about this school is how much money was put into it. The culinary program is what keeps the school running. I wasn't even there for 3 months, and I decided to call it quits. I'm a veteran, so I use my Post 9/11 to go to school. By enrolling in this establishment, my information was never submitted to the VA. So guess who didn't charge the first month and a half? I had to call the VA and see what was going on, then go to the financial aid department myself to tell you that for sure I never showed up. After that, online textbooks charge you \$200 dollars each semester for IT DOESN'T WORK! As hell we're charging hundreds of dollars for textbooks we can't access, and then being told to go get physical copies until further notice. How about you give us that money back? Since we pay out of pocket for these electronic textbooks. Payments are automatically removed from your account, and if you don't want to be removed, you'll need to submit a request form. Then go back to the financial aid department ... if you have a reimbursement of financial aid you can forget to receive it. I have a refund of over \$2000 just sitting there and its months, to tell you they are on hold. For months? I have emailed 2 financial aid members, including the manager to be told they are not sending stipends yet. Some of us have families and siblings to look after. This school is quick to take the money, but slow to return it again. From what I've read from other students, the reason this money isn't being refunded is because your pocket. To be honest it doesn't seem like the attention of the administrative staff too. When presenting the paperwork saying that I would no longer be present, I was asked why I was leaving; and if I had tried to find other resources to stay with the school.
