Visit the ODFW's agency site. Small spinners like 0 Mepps or 0 Blue Foxes work best. Why are they there? Heading north makes a difference. The most popular hooks for trout are the Eagle Claw Laser Sharp trout hooks. The most common variety available to most anglers is the coastal cutthroat found in many streams and beaver ponds in coastal drainages. Hold the rod in one hand with the bail open. In small streams they prefer aquatic insects nymphs that live under the rocks and along the stream bottom. In moving water it is the current, instead of your retrieve, that will affect how your lure moves in the water. It takes a lot less energy to move to shallower water, where the food is concentrated to feed, than it does to rise up through several feet of water to take insects spread out over a larger area. Redband trout inhabit cool streams and rivers, as well as some lakes, and they can grow up to 18 inches long. The colder the water temperature is the longer the development period. While technically not a trout they are a member of the char familytheir life history, ecology and habitat are similar to brown and rainbow trout. Not enough time to go fishing? While not true for all lakes, remember smaller spring fed lakes will have trout shallow all year. Traditionally for warm water fish like Walleye or Pike, you would fish on the side of the lake were the wind is blowing. After a short journey downstream the majority of the marshmallows have all fallen into a line, indicating where the current directs most of the food. Finding the bottom: The most important aspect of deep-water trout fishing is letting out line to get to the bottom. So some likely places to look for trout in rivers and streams include:. How big do they get? In streams, stoneflies will use these areas to crawl out of the stream during their emergence and use these areas to migrate out of the stream to begin their short lives as a flying insect. They commonly live for years but a few make it to the age of 5 or 6 years. Pools are definitely the most obvious places to find fish and can be the easiest but often fish that lie deep in pools are not feeding making them not so easy to catch.
