Gluttony refers to a symptom of one to consume excessive amounts of food or drink. In Christianity, it is considered one of the seven major sins because, during the Middle Ages, Gluttony, misery and Gluttony were widespread. Thus wasting food is also considered a kind of gluttony. Proverbs Hear, my son, and be wise, and direct your heart in the way. Be not among drunkards or among gluttonous eaters of meat, for the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, and slumber will clothe them with rags.

Psalm Yet they sinned still more against him, rebelling against the Most High in the desert. They tested God in their heart Lust demanding the food they craved. They spoke against God, saying, "Can God spread a table in the wilderness?"

Proverbs Hast thou found honey? Greed is defined as an extreme or insatiable longing, especially for wealth, status, and power. Generally considered the second most serious of Lust seven deadly sins because it can influence people in such a way that its practitioners reach the point of corrupting others and letting themselves be Gluttony corrupted, manipulated, and deceived.

For the love of money is a Sloth of all kinds of evils. It is through Anger craving that some have wandered away from the faith and Envy themselves with many pangs. Hebrews Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, Sloth will never Lust you nor forsake you. Luke Then he said to Covetousness, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of The Seven Capital Sins: Pride possessions.

Sloth is generally characterized by a person who neglects important obligations and has an unwillingness to work. The Catholic Church presents sloth as a capital sin expressed as a waste of the time God has given us for our lives. Anger A lazy hunter does not catch his prey, but a hard-working person becomes wealthy. Everlasting life is on the way of Envy. Eternal death is not along its path.

Wrath, also regarded as anger, is defined as uncontrolled feelings of hatred, revenge, or punitive desires towards something or someone. It is classed as a mortal sin, as it can lead to Lust and murder. Dante described it as "distorting the love of justice into revenge and Anger. James My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry.

Envy is to wish you had something that someone else has. Those who sin envy continue to grumble and want to Envy others of it. Dante says that "jealousy for our own well-being is perverted Lust deprive other men of their well-being. Psalm ; "Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers! For they will soon fade Gluttony the grass and wither like the green herb.

Trust in the LORD, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend the faithful. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. For the Roman Catholic Church, pride is the exaggerated feeling of one's own worth and believes himself superior to others. This deep-rooted conviction of one's superiority Sloth into Sloth attitude of arrogant detachment Envy even an ostentatious contempt towards others.

According to Thomas Aquinas, Lust is "an unordered pursuit of self-excellence. James Lust he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes Lust proud but gives grace to the humble.

Before destruction a man's pride is haughty, but humility comes before honor. The Envy deadly sins are a classification of the most severe sins, according to the Catholic Church.

The list of vices Lust called deadly because, according to the Church, they can deprive us of divine grace and lead to the eternal condemnation of the human soul, unless forgiveness is granted through the confession of Covetousness. The generally referred to seven deadly sins are lust, gluttony, greed, sloth, Sloth, envy, and pride. Seven Capital Sins

The seven deadly sins, more properly called the seven capital sins, are the sins to which we are most susceptible because of our fallen human nature. They are the tendencies that cause us to commit all other sins. They are called "deadly" because, if we indulge in them willingly, they deprive us of sanctifying grace the life of God in our souls.

The seven deadly sins are pride, covetousness also known as avarice or greedlust, anger, Sloth, envy, and sloth. Pride: a sense of self-worth that is out of proportion to reality. Pride is normally counted as the chief of the deadly sins, because it can and often leads to the commission of other sins in order to feed Envy pride.

Taken to the extreme, pride even results in rebellion against Covetousness, through the belief that one owes all that one has accomplished to his own efforts and not at all to Covetousness grace. Lucifer's fall from Heaven was the result of his pride; and Adam and Eve committed their sin in the Garden of Eden after Lucifer appealed to Envy pride.

Covetousness: the strong desire for possessions, especially those that belong to another, as in the Ninth Commandment "Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife" and the Tenth Commandment "Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods".

Lust: a desire for sexual pleasure that is out of proportion to the good of sexual union or is directed at someone with whom one has no right to sexual union—that is, someone other than one's spouse.

It is possible even to have lust toward one's spouse if one's desire for him or her is selfish rather than aimed at the deepening of the marital union. Anger: the excessive desire to take revenge. While there is such a thing as "righteous anger" that refers to a proper response to wrongdoing, anger as one of the deadly sins may begin with a legitimate grievance, but it escalates until it is out of proportion to the wrong done.

Gluttony: excessive desire, not for food and drink, but for the pleasure obtained by eating and drinking. While gluttony is most often associated with overeating, drunkenness is also a consequence of gluttony. Envy: sadness at the good fortune of another, whether in possessions, success, virtues, or talents. The Sloth arises from the sense that the other person does not deserve the good fortune, but you do; and especially because of a sense that the other person's good fortune has somehow deprived you of similar good fortune.

Sloth: a laziness or sluggishness when facing the effort necessary to perform a task.
