TSG is an organization committed to social justice and equity for all people. Toward that end TSG and our partners assist communities and organizations to identify and address unintentional or implicit sources of bias, inequities in practice and policy, and barriers that create the unequal access of vulnerable populations to all the resources and opportunities communities offer.

Using community research methods such as focus groups, key informant interviews, policy analysis, census reports, and community surveys, TSG consultants and partners provide a detailed description of community neighborhoods, vulnerable populations, common experienced barriers and inequitable conditions.

Equity Action Planning and Assessment

TSG and our partners have worked with foundations and nonprofits interested in beginning or adapting their current strategy to be more equity-focused. For example, a member of our team led the Aspen Institute's Roundtable Community Change's Racial Equity Leadership Development Project and codirected the Institute's project structural racism. She also led a large community-based effort to build the capacity of nonprofits to understand and implement strategies addressing racial inequities. Another team member guided a health foundation to become more equity-focused and create an intentional theory of change to make health equity the top-line goal of the Foundation. Another has worked with hundreds of nonprofits and several foundations to bring an intentional strategic focus and orientation to organizations serving vulnerable youth populations.
