I am very grateful for the friendship of Pastor Kiplagat, he is a godly pastor who has been preaching at his church for 21 years this month. We were able to be at their Sunday service and I was able to preach for their anniversary. I have spoken with him about my desire to reach Somalia with the Gospel, and he has responded with enthusiasm and an openness to go as well. Which, as I have quickly learned, it is not normal for anyone here to want to go to Somalia! Pray that God would use this young man in many great ways.

The last story, takes place in a dimly lit coffee shop in a small corner store. Bethany was finishing up a Bible with some ladies, when the waitress came and said she had noticed the Bibles and the conversation about the Lord. The ladies asked if they could pray for her- and she broke down and shared about some struggles in her life. It was such a blessing to see God use the testimony of one Bible study to witness to another lady.
