Prayer Update - February, 2020

RAINY SEASON UPDATE:

The worst of the rainy season should be past, but we appreciate your continued prayers as it's not quite over yet. We praise the Lord that the Arias family was able to return to Kiteni safely, arriving at 10:30 Tuesday night. The road from Cusco has had many rock, land and mud slides over the last few weeks, but the road was open on Tuesday. However, we had another very heavy rain that night after they arrived and the road was again closed this Wednesday morning. So, we are praising the Lord they got through.

Four days ago, not too far off of the route from Cusco, near Santa Teresa, a small creek was flooded and brought huge quantities of mud and rock down on a village called Sahuayaco. Many people lost their their homes and over 30 people are still missing. Because that flooding was heading our way, even Kiteni was on red alert. However, the flooding had dissipated during the several hours it took for it to travel this far and though the river did come up, it did not reach the proportions that were expected. A number of tourists were stranded in Santa Teresa due to the flooding and had to be evacuated by helicopter back to the city of Cusco.

Our daughter and son-in-law, Alex and Flora Herrera have been visiting his father on the coast who is very elderly and whose health is declining. They left Tacna yesterday to head back to Cusco and on to Pilcopata to continue their ministry. Please pray as they endeavor to get to Pilcopata this week. The road has been closed for the past several weeks due to massive mudslides that destroyed the entire road bed in several stretches over an 11 kilometer distance. Passengers were having to walk and climb a precarious temporary trail to get past the 11 kilometers and than catch another vehicle to continue on their journey. Obviously, this would prove very difficult for a family with two small children and their baggage. We are all praying that the road would be open in time for them to return to Pilcopata on Saturday.

Another prayer need for Alex and Flora is their monthly support. Since many of the country churches in our area cannot pay even their pastors, financial assistance to national missionaries is very limited. God has helped the Herrera family develop a cake-baking business to supplement their income. Unfortunately, both the cake-baking business and their monthly support are faltering in recent months, but we all know God has a plan.

ARÍN HOUSE UPDATE:

Many have been praying for the sale of our house in Arín. We'd like to challenge you to pray a little more specifically about the house. This special PRAYER CHALLENGE is for the CASA SEGURA CHILDREN'S HOME ministry to be able to purchase our house. Andrés and Jessica Melgar have five children of their own, as well as 4 children assigned to them by the Peruvian government. These children have been abandoned by their parents. The Melgar family come from Bolivia and they work with a ministry based out of Australia called CASA SEGURA. They now have government approval to set up a home for abandoned and orphaned children. The place they are renting in Yucay, near Urubamba, is inadequate and they are very interested in buying our house for their children's home. We

all agree that our house in Arin would provide a perfect place for this growing ministry, however, Casa Segura is lacking the funds to make a purchase possible. We would gladly donate the house for this purpose, but in view of some urgent personal and ministry needs, donating the house is not an option at this time. Would you join us, Casa Segura, and the Melgar family as we pray for God to provide the purchase price by the end of May? As always, we trust the Lord's sovereignty as He continues to lead us forward.

KITENI CHURCH NEWS:

March marks the beginning of the new school year in the southern hemisphere. That makes this a busy time of year as we endeavor to be a blessing and share the gospel in various ways:

- KITENI FAMILY NIGHT: We are having a Family Night
 evangelistic outreach in the town sports arena on March 19. We
 pray the games, prizes and food would attract families to this
 fun activity where they will hear the gospel message and receive
 some gospel tracts and New Testaments. Maybe this will also
 help explain our presence in town to many who suspect we are
 involved in the drug trade.
- CHISPAS CHILDREN'S BIBLE CLUB will have its kick-off at the Family Night and begin officially on March 22nd.
- TRAINING WORKSHOP FOR PASTORS AND LAY LEADERS: Also on March 22nd, during the evening service, Tim will begin his next training workshop for the 16 works and churches in this area. He will be using class notes and a Power Point presentation to teach the doctrine of the Holy Spirit. He will be teaching about 8 hours a day for 6 days, ending with lunch on March 28th. We look forward to working with Jack Vilca, a 26-year-old graduate of the Trujillo Bible School, as well as Pastor Rolando Árias. They will cover the evening services and gospel outreach.
- KITENI CHURCH CONSTRUCTION: Initial work for the Kiteni Church construction should start as soon as the heavy rains ease off, prayerfully in early April. We already have a faithful supporting church in Fairbanks, Alaska scheduled to come help us with this construction project in early October, and another church, also from Alaska, hoping to come down.
- **EVANGELISTIC MEDICAL CAMPAIGN:** Much prayer and preparation is going into the evangelistic medical campaign we will be hosting in Kiteni in June.
