Sometime later he left the house and that is when my parents got divorced. All that time, well almost all my life, I lived thinking that nobody wants me until I was 16 years old. I grew up with a grudge against my father, and other people. I can clearly remember my rebelliousness, disobedience and walking in the pleasures of this world. I was disobedient; I simply did not respect my mother, since there was only the two of us.

HOW GOD CHANGED MY LIFE ~ MY LIFE BEFORE I MET CHRIST

My name is **Julio** Edison Chipa Valverde and I am from the District of Curahuasi, Province of Abancay, Department of Apurimac. I was born in a Christian family. My parents are believers; my father is an example for me. What I can remember about my father is that every morning he would do his devotion. He would share with us what he learned in his devotional. He would talk to us about the gospel since we were little. I remember he would take us to church since we were little. I lived with my parents since I was little until I was 12. After that, I finished school. I went to study, away from my family and my community. I studied in a High school where my mother's family lived. I lived with my uncles, with my grandparents until I finished my high school, and from time to time I went home on the weekends. At the age of 18 I finished my schooling in the year 2012. After finishing high school, I went back home with my parents. Then, I decided to leave home again to work. When I left my house, I had a goal to work for a year and then return to my town. But it was not like that, I worked only six months and returned home. I worked on the farm helping my father. While there, my father encouraged me to go to church and always told me to follow in the Lord's way like my father. At that time, I decided to go to church. "One Sunday the Pastor invited those who wanted to receive Christ and I raised my hand. After the service we stayed in the church with Pastor Grimaldo Ojeda and he spoke to me about the gospel, that there were two paths, between which a person should choose which way to go. The narrow way that leads to eternal life, and the other wide way that leads to eternal death. So, I decided to choose the narrow way. After choosing, the pastor told me: "You have to ask God for forgiveness of your sin," and I asked for forgiveness, and then I asked Christ to come into my heart. Then we finished and left the church, it was in the year 2015 and I was also baptized. I also worked one year in my church as a secretary. That's how I was working, I remember the year 2016 when the seminary students came and encouraged me to study at SEBIC. In the year 2017, Pastor Juan Quispe arrived at the church of Solvario and Pastor Juan was just starting his ministry and he told me that he had studied in SEBIC as well. He also encouraged me a lot to be able to prepare myself to serve the Lord, so I came to study at SEBIC.

LIFE IN SEBIC I came to the seminary in 2017 when I was 22 years old. In my first year I had difficulty and struggle in my study because I did not know anything about the word of God. I did not understand the books I read. I was practically an unbeliever and could not understand the plan of salvation.

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Julio continued ~The Bible helped me to examine my life. The classes that really helped me was Discipleship and Personal Evangelism. I also listened to many sermons in the chapel, devotions in our room and examined my life which was really unsaved. I finished the first year and went home and was with my family and then returned to SEBIC. When I was in the second year of my studies, I knew I was still in doubt about my salvation. I thought about things that really frustrated me in my life and I had no peace and I came to the point of deciding that I really was not saved. On July 9, 2018 I had a truly conversion with Christ and I remember clearly that that night I had to give devotion in my room. The passage that I was going to share was (Acts 3: 12-26), this passage speaks of Simon Peter and John who were going to the temple. We saw Peter preaching and his message was focused on the Messiah. Peter was preaching to the Israelites about how they had denied the Messiah who was the author of the life and that they had crucified. I finished giving the devotional and Pastor Humberto was present and heard clearly the message I shared that night. Then Pastor Humberto went to (Acts 4: 1-4) and he showed us how Peter was taken to prison until the next day. Pastor Humberto said, with Peter's message many had converted to Christ and there were a number of 5000 people. This passage encouraged me to give my life to Christ. The Pastor ended with a prayer and after devotional time I said to Pastor Humberto "I want to accept Christ". He helped me to accept Christ and Pastor Humberto showed me other passages that spoke of how to receive Christ and also explained to me the doubt that I had in my life does not come from faith but is sin (Romans 14: 23).

From that day on, my life changed. I could understand the Word of God and then I went on vacation to my town. I was baptized on August 5, 2018 in the church of Solvario where I always attended before. Now I am growing every day in my spiritual life. And now I'm in 4th year, I remember that from 1st year to 4th year it was not easy. But it was a battle and struggle during these years and I'm still struggling, and I still have to reach the goal. I'm still struggling until I reach the goal I set and I'm achieving it with God's help.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE AFTER FINISHING SEBIC My plans after finishing my 4th year are to return to my town and serve in my area. Since I left my town my purpose was always to return and serve the Lord as a Pastor and before taking the leadership as a Pastor. The first thing I want to do is get married and having a wife. I want to start the ministry that God will give me. I know that God will give me the wife in due time, and I am praying to the Lord.

God's faithfulness during the pandemic and for those coming to the knowledge of the Savior, Jesus Christ.


Prayer Requests
