Seattle Children's Hospital

Department of Nursing Practice, Professional Development, & Innovation

Seattle Children's Hospital is situated in the Laurelhurst neighborhood of Seattle, Washington. Founded in 1907, the hospital accommodates 407 beds and its mission is *"We provide hope, care and cures to help every child live the healthiest and most fulfilling life possible."*

The Department of Nursing Practice, Professional Development, and Innovation (NPPDI) supports more than 2000 nurses across four states in the WAMI regions. The department also supports professional development of medical assistants, clinical technicians, CNAs and many others. It is the initial contact point for all nursing, NP, PA and CRNA students who train at Seattle Children's.

The department houses 40 NPD staff who are supported by four program administrators and one Learning Management System (LMS) specialist. Each unit oversees the education and professional development of all of the nurses on the unit. From NPD as a whole we offer: EBP fellowship, nurse educator leadership fellowships, nurse educator transition to practice programs, nursing research grants, schools of nursing, preceptor development, outreach education, RN residency, PALs/PEARS, and so much more!
